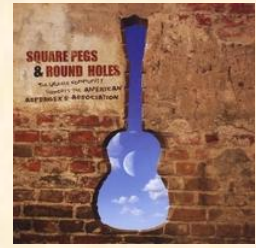




The Barnkickers
